

"I am the Gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly"... (John 10: 9-10)

This is one of the many "I am" statements of Jesus in John's Gospel.

This morning, we met for the Glacial Ridge Conference Pastors' gathering at Glenwood Lutheran Church. Pr. Krista Lee led a devotional base on the above passage, and one other, from John's gospel. What struck me was when she said: "I want to use the word 'door' instead of 'gate.' Think of how many doors you walked through before getting here today.

I thought of the door into the kitchen, then the bathroom, the apartment door, then through the coffee shop door, and the door into the church....then into the church in Glenwood... and in a lifetime, think of all those doors! She said: "Christ is walking with us through these many doors...."

Further, Christ is leading us, walking with us, through many doors to life. One of those doors is into the physical space of the church, for worship, learning, service and fellowship. Then we go back out that door into the world to serve Christ in our many vocations. We bear witness to God's goodness in our everyday lives.

We also go through many other doors, and figurative "doors" – doors leading into vocations, through the door of independence, or marriage, or college, or a new community, or workplace, or a new relationship, or retirement, or illness.

There are doors that we go through to gain wisdom and understanding, and others, to enter into new places where we can serve and grow as God's people.

What other spiritual or physical "doors" has God led you through in recent days? Months? Years? Christ is with us as we pass through these various doors.

When I entered the physical "door" at First Luther Church last fall, I didn't know if I would end up as pastor here or not. I wasn't sure of God's plan. I was willing, though, in faith, to walk through that "door" and see where it led. I believe Christ walked through with me. Of course, now I am your "new pastor" and a whole new "faith adventure" in ministry has opened up.

Another door... At our midweek service February 21st, we sang the new liturgy, "That You May Have Life" by Susan Briehl and Marty Haugen. Marty Haugen is the composer of Holden Evening Prayer, used here for Advent. I am thrilled that we are using this wonderful new, made-for-Lent liturgy. I have wanted to use it for several years. It is our hope, as Worship and Music Committee, that this new liturgy will deeply nurture our faith, build our sense of community, and strengthen our witness to the Gospel...

MY NEIGHBOR IS MUSLIM

Starting after Easter, on April 5th, we will begin a sevenweek study on Islam. Lutheran Social Services of MN has produced this excellent study, recruiting teachers from Luther College and Luther Seminary to help.

What are the basic beliefs of Islam? What do Muslims believe about Jesus? Do Muslims include Moses, and others, in their scriptures? What about Islam and violence? What are the Five Pillars of Islam? This study will cover these topics and more.

Islam is growing more rapidly than any other religion in the world, according to a new report by the Pew Research Center that says the religion will nearly equal Christianity by 2050 before eclipsing it around 2070, if current trends continue. We have Muslim neighbors in Minnesota, and right here in Morris. What do they believe? Why do they dress the way they do? Who are they?

We will meet on Thursdays at 6:00 p.m. each week starting April 5th, for a light supper and the study. Childcare will be available for those who have young children, yet who want to participate.




AREA CROP HUNGER WALK TO BE HELD ON APRIL 8

Join the effort to reduce local and world by taking part in the Morris area CROP Hunger Walk the afternoon of the Sunday after Easter, April 8. FLC is helping organize the event. It has a goal of raising \$2500 for our local Food Shelf and \$7,500 for programs of Church World Service, a partner of Luther relief and development programs. 200 walkers with \$50 of contribution will meet the goal. You may register to walk or sponsor a walker with a contribution at the office or at the "*Crop hunger walk*" web site

On October 17, 1969, a thousand people in Bismarck, ND, walked in what may have been the start of the hunger walks related to CROP – and raised \$25,000 to help stop hunger. Several other CROP Hunger Walks occurred soon thereafter, and before long there were hundreds of Walks each year in communities nationwide. Currently, well over 2,000 communities across the U.S. join in more than 1,300 CROP Hunger Walks each year. More than five million CROP Hunger Walkers have participated in more than 36,000 CROP Hunger Walks in the last two decades alone.

Current plan is to register at 12:30pm at the Federated church, experience hunger education by Reverends Del Sanderson and Marlin Mohrland, walk or cheer walkers on the 3.5 mile route, enjoy refreshments, a concert by the duo Dakota Road and end about 4:00pm. We encourage forming walking teams. You don't need to walk to participate.

- Church Council Installation Sunday will be on March 18th.


- Installation Service for Pastor Dan is being worked on and we are waiting on a date from the Synod office.

It's no fun to have the flu, and it's more dangerous than previously thought. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has revised its estimate of how many Americans die each year of flu-related complications from 20,000 to 36,000.

To help steer clear of the flu this season, get a flu shot. This is especially important if you are over 50 or have an impaired immune system or chronic medical condition. Mid-October to mid-November is the best time to get a flu shot, but you can still benefit from vaccination now, especially if you're at high risk of contracting the flu. Also get a flu shot if you'll be past your first trimester of pregnancy during flu season (October to April) or if you're a health care worker, child-care worker, police officer or firefighter.

Two alternatives to the traditional flu shot are:

- Intranasal flu vaccine (FluMist). This nasal spray vaccine was recently approved for use in healthy people ages 5 to 49. It can not be used in those with chronic diseases, such as asthma.
- Antiviral medications. Oseltamivir (Tamiflu). rimantadine and amantadine can be used for prevention as well as treatment if you can't take the flu shot or if your flu shot hasn't had enough time to build your immunity (2 weeks).

Other good flu-fighting strategies include:

- Washing your hands often, especially before touching your eyes or mouth. Use soap and warm water to wash all skin surfaces, rubbing vigorously for 15-30 seconds.
- Encouraging people around you to cover their mouths when they cough or sneeze; such as into a tissue or their bent elbow.

- Avoiding crowds when the flu season is at its peak
- Eating right, getting enough sleep and exercising regularly to help keep your immune system strong.

It is a Cold or the Flu?







Before you choose a treatment, it helps to know what you have. Distinguishing between a cold and the flu can be tricky. To be certain, doctors can now perform a quick office test that identifies influenza. The test eventually will be available as a home kit test. Meanwhile, here are symptoms to look for:

Symptoms	Cold	Flu
Fever	Rare	Characteristic, high (102-104 degrees); lasts 3-4 days
Headache	Rare	Prominent
General aches, pains	Slight	Usual, often severe
Fatigue, weakness	Quite mild	Can last up to 3 weeks
Extreme exhaustion	Never	Early and prominent
Stuffy nose	Common	Sometimes
Sneezing	Usual	Sometimes
Sore throat	Common	Sometimes
Chest discomfort, cough	Mild to moderate, hacking cough	Common, can become severe
Complications	Sinus congestion or earache	Bronchitis, can be life-threatening

Its been awhile since my last custodian corner and with the recent changes, I felt an update is due. The property is doing pretty good considering the cold weather and the only major issue was the broken glass door. Which was caused by a traditional funeral procession out the center door. It was purely accidental and has been repaired.

The ice build up continues to be a hazard at the rear (elevator) entrance. The Property Committee will continue to discuss the parking lot drainage and possible remedies. Please use caution when using this entrance.

We had a recent complaint regarding auxiliary doors and lights. These would be the doors that are not on the auto locks. The complaint, which had been resolved years ago, has compelled me to revisit the policy and procedures for building use. There is always a copy available in the office and if needed, please contact me directly.

Excluding a special event scheduled with the office, the staff has the property prepared for Sunday worship by the end of the day Friday. If an event (music practice, decorating, bible study, etc) occurs outside of the staff schedule, the organizer accepts the responsibility of using the facility and adhering to the rules. Assuming the responsibility falls onto the staff is not acceptable nor does a policy exist that requires the staff to check the premises 24 hours a day. We lock up according to the door schedule. Aside from special events scheduled with the office, we expect that all groups, committees and guests using the property outside of the door schedule, follow all the building use procedures. The only exception would be funerals, which are facilitated by our service group and they do an excellent job at properly shutting down the fellowship hall, cleaning (custodian), shutting off the lights and locking the delivery doors.

Working together through communication will create positive encouragement of proper building use and will help keep the property safe and secure for years to come. So if you turn a light on, please try and shut it off when you are finished. If you need to unlock an auxiliary door please try and remember to lock it back up. In addition, storage and clutter is becoming quite problematic again. If you have personal items being stored at the property, please make arrangements to have them picked up. The youth room has become a catch all for various items and we need to get that space back to a usable area for our youth.
