

Greetings from Pietermaritzburg, South Africa!

We write to you in this season here that is turning from winter to spring. We are feeling the air change and the rains have started to fall again. We are hoping there will be a lot of rain as Southern Africa is suffering from a severe drought. It has been quite a while since we have written. I hope you are tuned in to our blog (www.leisethfamily.wordpress.com) which we use as our primary location for sharing stories and experiences from our life in service.

Missionary Service:

We just completed our 4th year of service. It is hard to believe! It has gone so fast! We are grateful for all of the ways we are able to do this work as a family. In July, we did a little travel over the kids' school break. We did some personal travel but also had two opportunities to visit with church companions. One such visit was in the Devhula Leboa Circuit of the Northern Diocese, way in the northern part of the country. We were able to worship with one of the congregations and enjoy fellowship with church leaders. The next day, we visited the host home of one of the young adults volunteers. It was a nice visit all around but probably enjoyed most by our children was when the host mom, Mama Regina, taught the kids how to knock ripe fruit out of the trees in her yard. We all had a good time! While we are so enjoying our time of global service, it is also clear to us that it is time for a transition. With our children's ages (see kid update below), it is time to prepare to return to the U.S. for their secondary education. The YAGM group we are about to receive will be our last group.

Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM): I (Tessa) continue to be in the lead with the YAGM work, which is what brought us to South Africa 4 years ago. But Jon also has many gifts which he contributes to this work as well. We just finished with our 4th group. The Closing Retreat in July had many highlights, including the opportunity to spend time at the Global Village component of the International AIDS Conference in Durban. Even though we were not a part of the main-event (high ticket price) event, we were very impacted by this part of the conference. Southern Africa has a very high HIV rate. YAGM (and we) witness the impact of HIV/AIDS for those who are infected and affected. In addition to the conference, we spent time in reflection, play, and worship as the 9 young people who had served in Southern Africa prepared to return to lives in the United States.

Currently, we are waiting for our new group to arrive. They have experienced some delays as the protocols for obtaining a visa for South Africa have changed in the last couple of years. Despite everyone's best efforts, a couple of the new group are waiting for the consulate to finalize their visas. For all who are curious, if you have a U.S. passport, you can enter South Africa for 90 days as a tourist. But as the YAGM are here longer and are not tourists, they need permits. While the delay is frustrating, we are also mindful of people around the world who have daily challenges on a much larger scale related to immigration and movement.

Updates on the kids: Isaac is now 13 and in Grade 8. Sophia is 11 and in Grade 6. We can see the length of our time in South Africa as we look at how much our kids have changed. The kids began their new school year in January. Isaac completed Primary School and thus needed to begin high school in South Africa. He is at Maritzburg College, a public school in Pietermaritzburg. It is a place saturated with history. While Sophia began the school year missing having her brother with her at the same school, that is now a distant memory.

Jon's updates: Jon has continued to volunteer in the community in various ways and to continue to work with the YAGM program, although this year he has been especially focused on completing his M.A. in Lutheran Studies at Luther Seminary and finishing his process for rostering as a diaconal minister (now "deacon") in the ELCA. However, here's the biggest update of all. Jon has a new job ... in the United States! It is one of those opportunities that can't be passed up. He has accepted an appointment as the Minister of Faith and Spirituality in Action at Concordia College in Moorhead, MN! The good news, besides this wonderful job, is that we know where we will live next in the U.S. The bad news is that the timing isn't perfect and we will live different configurations of family during this coming year as we each transition at different times. For now, Jon will be heading to the U.S. in September to begin his new work. The kids will join Jon in the States in time to begin school in the U.S. in January and I will be in South Africa to see this work through. We wouldn't have chosen this way of doing it but we knew that our transition back to the U.S. would have challenges one way or another.

We give thanks to God for your continued support of the work we are a part of here in Southern Africa. We hope and pray that all is well for you and we look forward to hearing from you.





Vitamin & Mineral Supplements

Having the right balance of vitamins and minerals in your body is essential. Prolonged vitamin or mineral deficiencies can cause specific diseases or conditions, such as night blindness (vitamin A deficiency), pernicious anemia (vitamin B-12 deficiency), and anemia (iron deficiency). Too much of some vitamins and minerals can cause toxic reactions.

Vitamins and minerals are substances your body needs in small amounts for normal growth, function and health. Together, vitamins and minerals are called micronutrients. Your body can't make most micronutrients, so you must get them from the foods you eat, or in some cases, from supplements.

You need vitamins for normal digestion, mental alertness and resistance to infection. They enable the body to process proteins, carbohydrates and fats. Certain vitamins also help you produce blood cells, hormones, genetic material and chemicals of your nervous system. Unlike carbohydrates, proteins and fats, vitamins and minerals don't provide fuel (calories). However, they help your body release and use calories from food.

Should you take Supplements?

The American Dietetic Association and other major medical organizations all agree that the best way to get the vitamins and minerals you need is through a nutritionally balanced diet. However, sometimes a supplement may be appropriate.

Even if you don't have a vitamin or mineral deficiency, a vitamin or mineral supplement may be appropriate for you

- if you're a postmenopausal woman
- if you're on a very low-calorie diet
- if you smoke
- if you drink alcohol excessively
- if you're pregnant or breast-feeding
- if you eat a special diet

How much to you need?

Daily values (DV) are used on food and supplement labels. They have their origin in the Recommended Dietary Allowances (RDAs) but they're set by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). The FDA bases DVs on a 2,000calorie-per-day diet. Of course, the 2,000 calorie-per-day standard is just a guideline. Individual needs may vary. Many women and older adults may actually need only about 1,600 calories a day. Active women and most men need about 2,200 calories a day. Active men may need about 2,800 calories a day. If your calorie needs are greater or less than 2,000 per day, your DVs for various nutrients generally rise or fall accordingly.

Play it Safe

Before taking anything other than a standard multivitaminmineral supplement of 100% DV or less, check with your doctor or a registered dietitian. This is especially important if you have a health problem or are taking medications.

Absent were: Ryan Watzke, Jill Van Kempen, Barry Erdahl, and Pastor David Christenson.

Devotion: Al gave devotion from Mediation and the Mind of Man.

Pastor Dave presented the council with a written report prior to the meeting.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: It was moved by Dennis and seconded by Natasha to approve the minutes as printed. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: It was moved by Laurie and seconded by Dennis to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

- Music & Worship: The committee is recommending that "coffee hour" be changed to "fellowship hour", offer apple juice and/or lemonade, add various creamers, and review the coffee "recipe" for a more flavorful beverage, all with the intent of getting more people to join in. They are still looking for a couple people to go on the African trip in February.
- Congregational Life: Met and reviewed what the committee does, what all the subcommittees are, and who is on each of those committees. They will hold a

basket silent auction again in the fall and encourage members to consider creative options for auction items.

Old Business

- Polka Fest: The attendance was not what we had hoped but members enjoyed it.
- Church Service Worship Time: It was moved by Dennis and seconded by Kellie to have one service at 9:30. Motion carried.

New Business

- Church's Hours: It was moved by Dennis and seconded by AI to require that the last person to leave, including staff, pastor or those with a key, would lock the doors. Motion carried. It was moved by Dennis and seconded by Natasha to have the Exec Committee evaluate staffing options in the future. Motion carried.

- Music Director and Pianist Contracts: Music & Worship Committee reviewed and submitted new annual contracts for the pianist and choir director. It was moved by Laurie and seconded by Kellie to approve the contracts as presented. Motion carried.

It was moved by Natasha and seconded by AI to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 9:12 p.m., followed by the Lord's Prayer.

I am happy to announce that a few of the projects around the property are getting close to being completed. Words can not express the time and effort that our members have donated in order to have these improvements come to fruition.


