PASTOR'S PAGE

Summer is finally here. It was a sunny warm day recently, and I was out walking in my neighborhood. I saw a memorable scene. A man was mowing his lawn. Closely following behind him was a perhaps four-year-old boy, I assumed his son, who was trying to keep up, pushing his own toy lawn mower. It was a humorous, yet poignant, sight. I had to chuckle and smile, as the boy nearly ran to try and keep up with his father. It reminded me of my own sons, who used to stand on a stool, and practice shaving in the mirror, while their dad was shaving. We all learn by imitation.

This reminds me of a passage from I Corinthians. "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe." When Paul uses the word "believe" he also is implying "trust" and "follow."

I guess we who believe, trust and follow Christ could be called "fools," or "fools for Christ." Maybe we don't want to think of ourselves as fools, yet I think it is faithful, if humorous, to think of ourselves in this way. We may attempt great things for God, and "the world" may see this as foolishness. We may believe great things about God, and the world may see this as foolishness. The cross may seem like foolishness, our proclamation may seem like foolishness, yet, Paul declares "it is the power of God." ("For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power" – I Cor. 1: 17).

Some of us may even kiss a goat for the sake of raising offerings for hungry and oppressed people. Certainly this one is "a fool for Christ"! (June 2nd you can witness this during our 9:30 a.m. worship).

The Lord Jesus started with a small company of followers from whom little could be expected. Yet from them came the seeds of the greatest movement in history.

As the boy followed his father with his lawn mower, we are called by God's Spirit to follow Christ. Knowing what we do, we'd be a fool not to. He is "the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Let us be fools for Christ, finding joy, peace and life in him. And sharing his life and teachings with all.



PARISH NURSE NEWS

Talking With Kids About Drugs



Teaching your kids about the dangers of using illegal drugs is one of the most important things you can do as a parent. But it can be difficult to know how to begin.

How should you lay the groundwork with your preschooler? What's important for a teenage to hear? Here are some tips from the Partnership for a Drug-Free America.

Preschool

- □ Talk to your child about why it's good to be healthy. "I'm glad I'm healthy because...."
- ☐ Talk about harmful substances around the house and why they should be avoided.

Grades K-3

- $\hfill\square$ Tell your child how you feel about illegal drugs.
- ☐ Encourage your child to ask questions.
- ☐ Talk about why some drugs are illegal and how they hurt people.

Grades 4-6

- ☐ Make sure our child knows your rules against illegal drugs and the consequences from breaking them.
- □ Act out scenes where someone offers your child drugs.
- ☐ Focus on facts about drugs, not fears.

Grades 7-9

- □ Re-emphasize the rules and the consequences from breaking them.
- ☐ Emphasize how drugs detract from a person's appearance.
- □ Discuss what your child has learned about drugs in school.

Grades 10-12

- □ Emphasize how drugs can destroy a teen's future.
- ☐ Use relevant news reports to begin discussions.
- ☐ Compliment your teen on the good choices he/ she makes.

Make sure your kids know that it's dangerous to use household items such as glue and cleaning chemicals as mind-altering substances.

Winning Strategies for Dads

Hey, Dad! Do you want your kids to feel better about themselves, have healthy attitudes about relationships, even do better in school? Then get involved with your children's lives. Consider these possible ways of becoming the best father you can be.

- Let them see that you respect their mother.
- Spend time with your children. Participate in their lives, from volunteering in their classrooms to tucking them into bed.
- Set clear rules and expectations.
- Be a positive role model.
- Be affectionate. Give your children hugs and kisses every day.
- Eat together as a family.
- Read to your children.
- Make time to listen. Encourage your children to express ideas, thoughts and feelings to you.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dan gave an oral report. A female chaperone is being sought for the summer youth Duluth trip. Members have pledged \$7,560 for the Multi Congregation Youth Program Director.
